

Introduction to preparing an application for NIHR/HEE Clinical Doctoral Research Fellowship

The NIHR/Health Education England Clinical Doctoral Research Fellowship (C-DRF) scheme is aimed at post-degree health professionals sited in England who

- have at least 1 years experience of clinical practice since graduating,
- have had sufficient research experience or research training to prepare them to undertake a PhD
- wish to obtain a PhD by research whilst still developing their clinical skills.

The C-DRF is an individual training award and offers funding to cover the salary costs of the award holder, their PhD tuition fees, and the costs of an appropriate research project and training and development programme. A C-DRF award will require that the individual has a contract of employment with the Host Employer for the duration of the Fellowship.

Applications for Round 5 in 2015

These are highly prestigious and competitive awards and applications for the next round of fellowships will open in February 2015.

From 2015, these awards will be available to many more registered non-medical health professionals.

Introductory Workshop

Preparing an application for this award takes considerable time, planning and effort and applicants often underestimate what is required to pull together the different aspects of the application.
